# What is the Fellowship Fund?

Financial support in the form of an interest-free loan or gift to 'tide you over' in times when changes in circumstances cause financial concern/hardship. The most usual reason for an application will be a need for short-term help which arises as a result of unforeseen circumstances, for example following loss of employment, cuts in benefits or a sudden illness.

The Fund is unlikely to be suitable for providing long-term financial support, although it could play a role in bridging a gap until a more permanent solution is put in place. In any case, each situation presented to the committee will be considered on its own merits.

It is not a financial advice service (although we can suggest other agencies which might also help such as the Debt Advice Service).
